This past Thursday, the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade track teams competed in a meet against Issaquah Middle School. All three Hawk teams had an outstanding performance against the Panthers.

The first place winners were **Sam Egan** (1600), **Joe Kinner** (100 meter dash), **Troy Christ** (200 meter dash), **Gabby Hamilton** (hurdles), and **Angelina Belceto** (long jump). Both 6th grade teams took first in the Medley Relay as well. Way to go Hawks!

The 7th grade girl's and boy's teams came up short in their meet against Issaquah. For a small team these athletes worked their hearts out. Some first place stars were **Reid Malmquist** (800 meter run), **Jack Nordby** (shot put and discus), and **Laurel Meredith** with three first places in the hurdles, 100 meter dash, and high jump. Fantastic effort!

The 8th grade girl's team lost a close one with a score of 57-48. **Ashley Jackson** led the team with three first place victories in the hurdles, 400 meter dash, and the 200 meter dash. 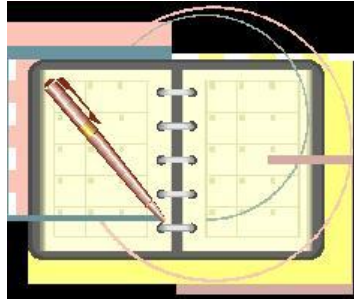
