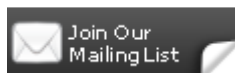

Congratulations! Chief Kanim Middle School is a recipient of the 2010 Washington Achievement Award....

The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction and the State Board of Education created the Washington Achievement Award to celebrate our top-performing schools and to recognize achievement in multiple categories. This highly selective award is based on your school's performance according to the Washington Achievement Index, a comprehensive measurement of how schools in Washington are performing over time. The Washington Achievement Award is given to elementary, middle, high and comprehensive schools in seven different categories: overall excellence, language arts, math, science, improvement and closing achievement gaps. Chief Kanim Middle School is being recognized for:

Overall Excellence (Second year in a row) - Middle School Special Recognition (Second year in a row) - Science

Chief Kanim Middle School was one of only 19 Middle School's in the state to earn the Overall Excellence award and one of only two schools for science recognition.
